Using Cascade 220 Pattern**

MATERIALS: Circular Needles, US 13 & 11
Double Pointed Needles US 11
5 stitch markers

YARN COMBINATIONS:

Cascade 220 2 hanks, double stranded, try different colors

Cascade 220 1 hank, single stranded
Lana d Oro 2 hanks, single stranded

Lana d Oro 4 hanks, double stranded

Pastaza 2 hanks, single stranded

Cascade 220 1 hank, single stranded
Luxury Mohair 2 skeins, single stranded

Lana d Oro 2 hanks, single stranded
Luxury Mohair 2 hanks, single stranded

Pastaza 2 hanks, single stranded
Luxury Mohair 2 hanks, single stranded

Have fun and let your imagination go. Try different color and fiber combinations.
Using size 13 needles, loosely cast on 100 stitches. Place a stitch marker between every 20 stitches.
Being careful not to twist stitches, join and knit evenly for 2 to 3 inches.

Decrease 2 stitches in each section (k2tog, knit 8) repeat around. 90 stitches. Change to size 11 needles and knit evenly for 3 inches more.

Decrease 4 stitches in each section (knit 3, k2tog) repeat around. 70 stitches

Continue knitting for 8 more inches.

CROWN:

ROW 1: Decrease 2 stitches in each section (k2tog, knit 5) repeat around 60 stitches.

ROW 2: Knit 1 round

ROW 3: Change to the double pointed needles (knit 2, k2tog) repeat around, 15 stitches on each needle. 45 stitches

ROW 4: Knit 1 round

ROW 5: K2tog, knit 1, repeat around. 10 stitches on each needle. 30 stitches

ROW 6: Knit 1 round

ROW 7: K2tog until only 6 stitches remain.

Cut yarn and thread through a tapestry needle, pulling through the 6 remaining stitches. Pull to the inside of hat and secure.

Weave in all ends before felting.

TO FELT:

Place hat in a mesh lingerie bag. Set your washing machine for a small load, hot wash/cold rinse cycle, with a little soap. It may take 2 to 3 cycles to complete the felting process. This is dependent on the water temperature and type of cycle used.

Place hat on a medium size bowl, saucepan, or wig form. Shape the brim as desired. Allow to dry. Drying may take from 1 to 3 days depending on the location for the hat.

When dry, enjoy your hat. Make several, a girl can never have too many hats.
